## How to Host a Composition Contest

- Select the specifications: Ensemble type (your ensemble, as standard as possible), difficulty level, length, style (if desired)
- Decide on other aspects: Will there be a fee? What will be the award, and how many winners? Will the winner need to attend the premiere performance in person?
- Select your judges: Ideally you would have the ensemble director, some composers, and some performers on the panel.
- Create a call, and decide on how to host the contest (email submissions or site hosting, such as <a href="https://newmusicengine.org/">https://newmusicengine.org/</a>)
- Advertise on various sites (see below), and open the call
- Allow about three months for the open call
- Close the call, and begin judging
- Select winner(s)
- Contact winner(s), non-winners; announce winner(s)
- Make arrangements with winner(s) regarding various things
- If the contest is to commission a piece, then work with composer on details/contract
- Premiere performance of winning composition(s)!
